

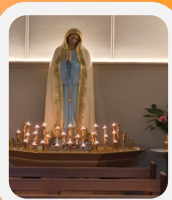

This week we have celebrated the memory of Blessed Catherine McCauley. In 1831. this amazing woman planted a seed of compassion that became the Sisters of Mercy. People called them the “Walking Nuns”.

She believed that education especially for the girls of that time, was crucial to help overcome poverty and exploitation.
