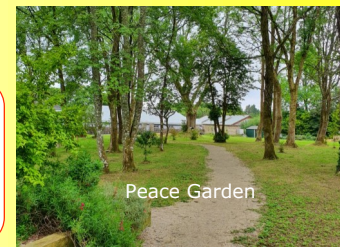

Unfortunately we are once again forced to postpone our Confirmation. I cannot tell you how sorry I am, as are Fr. Frankie, Sr. Helen and Ms. McLoughlin. We have talked at length to try to decide what to do next. Clearly, it would be pointless to set another date. None of us know when these restrictions will be lifted and, in any case, over the Summer, it would be very difficult to arrive at a date that would suit everyone. Therefore, our intention is to aim for a date as early as possible in the next school term when the children will be back in their schools, subject, as we always are, to the guidelines that will be in place at that time. If, at that stage, we are still not allowed to gather for the ceremony, we may have to consider confirming the children in small groups as part of scheduled Masses in our parish.

So it's a sad way to end the Sixth Class year. But let's try to be optimistic and say that maybe Confirmation will be a special way to begin the Secondary School years for the boys and girls. We have to keep looking forward.

Children attending Kidz Time and the local National School use the garden as a place to walk and play. The garden has old trees preserved, flowers and plants, an old font that was dug up during clearing and a contemplative walkway. In fact, in many ways, the garden can be viewed as a sensory experience due to the different textures of walkways, the flowers and the trees.

There is a poly tunnel where some families avail of a raised bed to grow their own vegetables. Other beds contain vegetables of a wide variety, grown from seed.
