COP 26 Meeting in Glasgow.

Pope Francis has appealed to decision makers who gather in Glasgow to "provide effective responses" to the ecological crisis and to "offer concrete hope" to future generations.

Pope Francis writes: It is worth repeating that each of us—whoever and wherever we may be—can play our own part in changing our collective response to the unprecedented threat of climate change and the degradation of our common home. I was impressed by something said by one of the scientists. He told us: If things continue as they are, in 50 years time my baby granddaughter will have to live in an unliveable world. "We cannot allow this to happen!"

It is essential that each of us be committed to this urgent change of direction, sustained by our own faith and spirituality.
