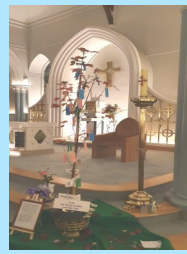

A Month of Memory – November.

“Try to remember the kind of September , when life was slow and oh, so mellow.....
when grass was green and grain was yellow.....
that no one wept except the willow...
When love was an ember about to billow... try to remember’.

Memory is a most precious gift. God gave us our memories so that we could have roses in December. There is nothing more heartbreakingly poignant than to see a friend or family member lose their battle with Alzheimer's, a most cruel illness as they slowly lose us and as we lose them in their forgetfulness.

Memory is precious. November is that time of year when we celebrate the memory of those who live forever in our heart space; those who shared their life with us and those who gave us the gift of life itself. I have a friend who writes his own litany of all the people who have mattered most in his life and now live their life in God. A lovely way to pray our November prayer of memories perhaps would be to write our own list that is our own litany. We name again those who have touched our lives and stretched our imagination; those good people who with a smile of kindness and compassion have made us the people we are. After each name we could whisper ... “Pray for us” and we know for certain that they will and they do even without us asking.

November is that time when we visit our Cemetery, the resting place of family and friends and the forgotten ones who are always held safe always in the memory of God. I really like the way we celebrate our Cemetery Sunday in Summertime now, not in the dark dreary days of November. The landscape of Summer is a far better backdrop for celebrating hope, faith and love remembered. A visit to the Cemetery is a slow trip down memory lane to shed a tear or to whisper a name that is always a prayer of love and sometimes a prayer of forgiveness. In this way we give thanks for that list, that litany of our own Saints and Sinners sometimes the same person. We know for certain that we are held in their prayer of Resurrection, and because of them and their living memory we are better people, or at least we can try to be better people.
